b. Motion 2018-18; Requesting approval of the placement of café tables and chairs in front of Difebos and the Globe.

### 3. Departmental Reports:

a. Finance Director - Natalie Saleh

Ms. Saleh noted that preparation for the audit continued and that customer service was working with the Utility Departments inventorying meters.

b. Administrative Services Director - Mary Bohlen

Ms. Bohlen indicated that the fence posts for the Stephen Decatur Park tennis courts had been placed and that the engineer felt that the project would be complete by the end of the month.

- c. Water Resources/Public Works Director Jane Kreiter absent
- d. Electric Utility Director Tim Lawrence

Mr. Lawrence noted that LED lighting replacement at the Savage Substation and Power Plant was ongoing; this project was funded by a Maryland Smart Energy Community grant. He also indicated that the plant had operated during peak occurrences a total of seven times since January. Two recent power outages were caused by a Delmarva Power issue that Berlin and DPL were working to resolve.

Councilmember Tyndall thanked the Electric Department for a recent streetlight replacement.

### e. Police Chief - Arnold Downing

Chief Downing provided an update on the recent National Night Out and indicated that he had recently attended a School Safety Conference. The Police Department would be assisting Worcester Youth and Family with an upcoming trip to the trampoline park. He had also recently attended a meeting with English-as-a-Second-Language students at James M. Bennett High School in Salisbury. Mayor Williams noted issues of bicycles being left laying on sidewalks and discussion followed regarding educating bicyclists, both youth and adult. Chief noted that anyone could call the police department and that the officer would attempt to locate the cyclist.

f. Planning and Zoning Director - David Engelhart

Mr. Engelhart noted that the Planning Commission had met on Wednesday August 8, 2018 and discussed a request to add land located at Rt. 50 and Rt. 346 to the Town's growth area. The Planning Commission recommended that the Mayor and Council move forward with the change to the Growth Area and necessary amendment to the Comprehensive Plan. A public hearing would be scheduled at an upcoming Mayor and Council Meeting. In response to a question from Councilmember Brittingham, Mr. Engelhart indicated that - of the 18 attendees who had attended the Planning Commission Meeting - 12 had spoken in favor of the addition and six against.

g. Economic and Community Development Director – Ivy Wells

Ms. Wells extended her congratulations to the Berlin Little League on their recent performance. She noted that an office in the Welcome Center had recently been rented and reviewed upcoming events. She also noted that wayfinding signs would be delivered and that she would be assisting Public Works with placement. She reminded all that the deadline to submit application for downtown events for calendar year 2019 was September 1, 2018.

h. Managing Director - Jeffrey Fleetwood

Mr. Fleetwood reminded all that milkshakes would be available at Town Hall on Wednesday, August 15, 2018 from 11:00 AM to 1:00 PM and that a retirement party celebrating Billing Utility Supervisor Geneva Peter's retirement after 44-years of service would be at 1:00 PM that afternoon.
